Kuskokwim River Salmon Fishery Announcement #7

Emergency Order #3-S-WR-7-22

This is an announcement from the Alaska Department of Fish and Game in Bethel for subsistence fishermen in the Kuskokwim Area.

As of August 14, the Bethel test fishery cumulative CPUE for coho salmon was 746 (2008–2021 average is 2,112) and the total estimated passage past the sonar was 104,346 coho salmon. Inseason assessment at this time indicates that the coho salmon escapement goals at the Kwethluk River weir and Kogrukluk River weir will not be met. Therefore, subsistence fishing restrictions are needed to protect coho salmon returning to the Kuskokwim River.

In the Kuskokwim River and Kuskokwim River tributaries (Subsistence Sections 1-5, Mouth of Kuskokwim River to Headwaters), the following management actions will be in effect from 12:01 a.m. Wednesday, August 17, 2022, until 11:59 p.m. Thursday, September 15, 2022:

- Subsistence fishing with gillnets (set or drift), fishwheels, beach seines, and dip nets will be closed in all <u>flowing waters</u> of the Kuskokwim River and Kuskokwim River tributaries from the mouth of the Kuskokwim River upstream to the headwaters of the Kuskokwim River.
- Subsistence fishing with hook and line for coho salmon will be closed in the Kuskokwim River drainage. Any coho salmon caught while fishing for other salmon and non-salmon fish species must be returned alive to the water.
- Subsistence fishing with gillnets (set or drift), fishwheels, beach seines, and dip nets will remain open in <u>non-flowing waters</u> which includes lakes, ponds, backwaters, and oxbow lakes of the Kuskokwim River and Kuskokwim River tributaries from the mouth of the Kuskokwim River upstream to the headwaters of the Kuskokwim River. Subsistence fishing in these areas should target whitefish, pike and other non-coho salmon species.
- Subsistence fishing with gillnets (set or drift), fishwheels, beach seines, and dip nets will remain open in the Gweek, Johnson, Kialiq, Kinak, Tagayarak, and Eenayarak rivers100-yards upstream from their confluence with the Kuskokwim River
